Below is a list of questions for the Stakeholder's Interviews that will be held on February 12th. These questions will serve as a starting point for discussion on the Historic Preservation Regulations and Code Update.

Questions:

- Are Sausalito's regulations effective in preserving historic resources?
- What are the major problems and issues with Sausalito's approach to historic preservation?
- Thinking about a specific project or projects with which you are familiar, how did the City's historic preservation regulations affect the outcome?
 - Would different regulations have resulted in "better" projects?
 - o If not, what would have made a difference?
- Do you think the regulations related to historic preservation are understandable and easy to use? If not, what are the problems?
 - o Which of these is the most significant in terms of their effect on the preservation of historic resources?
- What changes would you like to see made in the City's approach to preservation?
 - O What should not be changed?
- How well is the review process working?
 - o Are the review authorities of the Historic Landmarks Board and Planning Commission appropriate? Should the role of either body in the review process be changed?
 - What types of projects should be reviewed administratively by staff?
 - o Is the process for the designation of landmarks and historic districts appropriate? Do the current regulations help or hinder the designation properties as landmarks?
